Hong Kong Living, the team behind the successful Hong Kong Living Awards and Hong Kong Dining Awards, is proud to announce a brand new initiative to celebrate the outstanding achievements of Hong Kong's top international schools, principals, teachers and the wider education community. The Hong Kong Education Awards will evaluate the performance of international schools based on academic performance, student engagement, campus culture and people. The awards will be decided by an independent panel of education experts, academics and consultants covering the 2020 academic year. Winners will be announced during an awards ceremony in June 2021.

CATEGORY DESCRIPTIONS

Education Consultancy of the Year

Recognises the important role of education consultants in helping to connect schools with prospective students, in addition to improving the overall education community through outreach programs, training and recruitment.

Best Tutoring Centre

This award will recognise the important role tutoring centers play in furthering academic achievement. Be it language, science, music, art or maths, judges will consider the success of the center over the past year and how it has shifted to online learning and homeschooling. To be eligible, the centre must hold a certificate of school registration from the Education Bureau of Hong Kong.

Best After School Program

Recognises the most comprehensive after school program in Hong Kong. Judges will be looking for innovative teaching methods and a high quality of teaching staff and how the business has adapted to online learning and homeschooling.

Best Language Centre

This category recognises the important role of language centers in Hong Kong. From English to Mandarin, Japanese or Korean, judges will be looking for innovative teaching methods, a high quality of teaching staff and how the center adapted during 2020.

Best School - Arts

Recognises a school that offers the most comprehensive arts program in Hong Kong. Applications can range from classical art to new forms of graphic design, digitally-inspired work and can also include painting, sculpture, music, theater and dance. Judges will consider all areas of the arts program, including staffing, funding, resources and results.

Most Socially Responsible School

Recognises a school that goes beyond the traditional educational experience. From innovative approaches to learning, physical setting of classrooms, innovations in curriculum, community contribution and environmental awareness, we are on the hunt for those who are creating globally-minded students ready for an ever-changing world.

Best School - STEM

Recognises a school that offers the best science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) program in Hong Kong. Judges will look at how the school developed its STEM program, performed against other schools, recruited relevant staff and showed outstanding leadership in the field of STEM education.

Best School - Humanities and Social Sciences

Recognises the best humanities and social sciences program in a Hong Kong school. Judges will look at how the program helped students to become leading global citizens by cultivating critical thinking, moral reasoning and analytical skills necessary to thrive in a rapidly changing world.

Best School - Physical Education

Recognises the best physical education program in a Hong Kong school. Judges will look at how the school developed its sports program, invested and hired relevant staff to bolster its credentials in encouraging sport and sport science as a key pillar.

Special Education School of the Year

Recognises the most outstanding special education school in Hong Kong that provides care and dedication to students with special education needs. Judges will look for a balanced programme that adapts to individual student needs and includes a range of innovative learning opportunities.

Support Staff of the Year

Often referred to as the backbone of the classroom and an asset to the teachers they support, this category is open to all classroom assistants, teaching assistants, learning mentors, learning support assistants and those involved directly in supporting teaching and learning. This category is open for nominations.

Best Technology Program

Recognises the best use of technology by a Hong Kong school, especially in response to Covid-19. Judges will evaluate how a school embraced technology to reshape the learning journey and how technology made a positive impact on a student's learning and school experience.

Best School Strategic Plan

Recognises those that have a clear and well communicated vision for the future. Judges will look at how that vision prepares students for the future and how that vision resonates with the wider community. The plan can be applied to a specific project or a larger, school-wide initiative.

Best Student-Centered School

Recognises a school which puts student needs at the heart of its operation, from wellbeing and counselling programs to innovative curriculum and individual experiences for those with learning needs. Judges will consider schools that seek student representation and challenge perspectives, promote tolerance and prepare students for a life beyond education.

Kindergarten of the Year

Recognises the most outstanding kindergarten in Hong Kong that demonstrates a consistently high standard of teaching and learning. Judges will look for strong academic achievements, innovative teaching methods, dedication to staff and student communications and a commitment to continuous academic improvement.

Principal of the Year - Kindergarten /Primary/ Secondary/All-through School

These four awards recognises the most outstanding principal of a kindergarten/ primary/ secondary/ all-through school in Hong Kong. Judges will look for effective leadership, a balanced approach to education and a commitment to the wellbeing of staff, students and the community. Judges will consider the success of the school and the team the principal has built. This award is open to nomination by teachers, parents and students.

Primary School of the Year

Recognises the most outstanding primary school in Hong Kong that demonstrates a consistently high standard of teaching and learning. Judges will look for strong academic achievements, innovative teaching methods, dedication to staff and student communications and a commitment to continuous academic improvement.

Secondary School of the Year

Recognises a secondary school in Hong Kong that demonstrates a consistently high standard of teaching and learning. Judges will be looking for strong academic achievements, innovative teaching methods, dedication to staff and student communications and a commitment to continuous academic improvement.

All-Through School of the Year

Recognises the most outstanding all-through school in Hong Kong that demonstrates a high standard of teaching and learning. Judges will look for strong academic achievements, innovative teaching methods, dedication to staff and student communications and a commitment to continuous academic improvement.

Teacher of the Year

This award recognises a teacher who has made an outstanding impact on students learning experience and consistently demonstrates an outstanding commitment to professional development. Nominees must have excellent subject knowledge, innovative teaching practices and the ability to prepare students for life beyond education. This award is open to nomination to all teachers currently employed in a school in Hong Kong.

Hong Kong International School of the Year

This award recognises the most outstanding international school in Hong Kong. Finalists in this category have demonstrated exceptional leadership, a commitment to professional development, outstanding academic achievements and a commitment to innovation and new ways of learning.

Boarding School of the Year

Recognises the most outstanding international boarding school in Hong Kong that offers a holistic education and boarding experience for students. Judges will consider academic excellence, social development and a positive learning environment. Judges will look at the school's well-rounded curriculum and the diversity of extracurricular activities.

JUDGING CRITERIA

The Hong Kong Education Awards will send final submissions to an independent panel of judges, comprising education industry leaders and senior representatives. Judges will be well known and respected throughout the education industry and their judgment will be impartial, balanced, incisive and fair. Judges will review submissions and allocate a score for each finalist. The finalist with the highest score in each category once the judging process has been completed will be named the winner.


Academic Performance	25%	Schools must demonstrate how their students performed in the 2020 academic year across all curriculums, including IB (PYP, MYP, DP & CP) Montessori, EYSF, International Primary Curriculum, British National Curriculum, A-Level, Chinese National Curriculum etc. Judges will also consider non-academic performance and engagement with the wider community from sporting programs to the arts, science and technology.
People & Ethos	25%	Schools must demonstrate how they succeed in managing their key resource - people. Judges will be looking at how key hires, internal promotions, training, staff development and incentive programs shaped the school and its culture. Judges will take into consideration how the school encouraged inclusiveness, community engagement, character development and cultivated a positive school climate.
Vision	25%	Demonstrate how the school is rising to the challenges of a fast-moving and rapidly- changing education sector. This is your opportunity to show how the school has embraced the challenges of technology and new education initiatives to create independent critical thinkers and responsible global citizens.
Student Experience	25%	Demonstrate how the school stood out from others in the industry by offering a rich and rewarding education experience. Judges will be looking for initiatives that enhance student life from counselling and mental health support to a rejuvenated school campus, a healthy student to teacher ratio and links with other organisations be it charitable or professional.

Eligibility

Submissions are open to any school and education-related businesses based in Hong Kong or the Hong Kong office of a global company for the 2020 academic year.








Divya Samtani
